It will be mailed to everyone on the College's mailing list and will appear in the website, re-designed this year. The brochure will be printed in greater numbers than usual for wider distribution.

Registration for the classes will be accomplished by mail and will be conducted, through Sept. 10.

The Shaker course will be held at the museum in Alfred and Politics and the 2018 Election at Huntington Common in Kennebunk. The popular **Bring a Book to Breakfast** again will meet at the Springvale Library, and **Out in the Woods and Discovering the Eastern Trail by Bike** will meet in nature's ubiquitous open air classroom.

Saco classes will meet at several sites and those in Springvale at the Anderson Center.
